Impact of COVID 19

Currently, we are taking the following precautions to protect students and staff from the threat of COVID 19:

- All high touch surfaces in classrooms are repeatedly cleaned during the day
- Students wash their hands; when they arrive at school, before recess and before lunch

Our philosophy

We believe children learn best when they feel safe and secure, have a sense of belonging as well as feel connected to people and their learning environment.

Our Early Childhood classes aim to provide a developmentally appropriate curriculum that balances explicit teaching with opportunities develop through that agency child-initiated experiences. We focus on early literacy and numeracy skills while developing social, emotional and physical wellbeing. Meaningful experiences that are relevant to the child's world promote problem solving, exploration, creativity, communication and social competency. We recognise the importance of a stimulating environment to spark curiosity and promote a culture of independence.

Our teaching and learning cycle includes ongoing reflection to guide future planning directed to meet the needs of individual children helping them to reach their full potential.

We regularly evaluate our work against the National Quality Standards for Early Childhood Education.

Our whole school behaviour goals

We actively implement the Positive Behaviour Support (PBS) program which places a major focus on proactively teaching appropriate behaviour. The following key elements help to create a safe, positive and productive learning environment:

- · Clearly defined and taught behaviour expectations
- Consistent and frequent acknowledgement of appropriate behaviour
- Constructively and specifically addressing problem behaviour
- Effective use of behaviour data to assess and inform decision making.

We have four whole school behaviour expectations or goals:

- Be your best
- Be resilient
- Be respectful
- Be safe and caring.



Developing a partnership in learning

We want to build a strong partnership with you because we know that this will benefit your child. These are some of the ways we communicate with you:

- Staff are on hand at the beginning and end of every day and appointments can be made for longer conversations
- Messaging through the Class Dojo app
- Classes have a daily notice board outside the classroom door
- You will receive an email inviting you to set up a Connect parent account
- Staff put notes into students' take home folders
- A whole school newsletter is sent out via email on Friday of the odd weeks of term
- You can join our <u>Facebook</u> page.

We encourage you to sign up on your child's classroom roster to help out and speak to your child's teacher regularly.

Growing independence and confidence

Our aim is to support you and your child through any separation anxiety which your child might experience when first attending school. Typically, we offer an orientation session during Semester Two which will give your child an opportunity to become familiar with their new school.

We encourage parents to join your child for an early morning activity. Once the bell is rung, we ask that you say 'goodbye' unless you are staying for parent roster. However if this is proving difficult for your child, we will work with you to ensure a smooth transition to independence.

At the end of the day, please remain on the verandah until your child is released to your care.

Meeting the needs of your child

Research shows that specialist programs have the greatest impact on a child when they are younger. During kindergarten, our School Health Nurse will check your child's development. School staff continually use evidence based programs to assess your child and plan for their progress. Rest assured staff will contact you if there are any concerns.

We are fortunate to have a regular service from several experts including a Speech Pathologist, Occupational Therapist and School Psychologist. If it is appropriate your child's teacher will talk to you about referring your child. Your child's teacher may also work with you to formulate an Individual Education Plan to support their learning. If you have any concerns about your child, talk to their teacher.

Your child's health

If your child has a health condition which requires support at school such as an allergy, asthma, seizures or diabetes please contact us so that we can organise appropriate assistance.

If your child requires medication temporarily, such as antibiotics, you must sign a form giving your permission for staff to administer the medication.

If your child has a communicable disease you can ask advice from your doctor about when they should return to school, contact us directly or have a look online for the Department of Health, 'Communicable Disease Guidelines' (2017).

We are allergy aware

Some of our students have a potentially life threatening allergy to nuts so we are committed to being an allergy aware school. Most reactions happen when nuts are eaten but serious reactions can also occur from skin or eye contact or breathing in nut particles. Therefore, we ask that you help us keep all our students safe by avoiding sending loose nuts or food containing nuts to school, such as, peanut butter.

What to wear

Children need to wear comfortable clothes which are suitable for play. Having a school dress code plays an important role in creating a sense of belonging so we encourage kindy and preprimary students to wear school uniform.

What to bring

Your child needs to bring:

- A broad brimmed or legionnaire style hat
- A piece of fruit or a salad vegetable
- Lunch
- A water bottle
- A bag suitable for carrying your child's belongings
- A change of clothes

In order to reduce the risk of skin cancer, during Terms One and Four children without hats are asked to play on the verandah. Naming your child's belongings makes it easier for them to look after their property. A list of student requirements will be sent to you before the start of the new school year.

Travelling to school

We ask that kindy and pre-primary students are collected from their classroom. If the person collecting your child or their normal way of travelling home changes please let the class teacher know before 2:30pm.

If you reside more than 4.5km from our school, you can apply online for your children to travel on a school bus. The website is: <u>www.schoolbuses.wa.gov.au</u> An education assistant brings the kindy and pre-primary students to and from the bus each day.

When possible we encourage you to walk or cycle to school. We ask all parents to keep strictly to the speed limit when driving around the boundary of our school.

ATTENDANCE

- You must notify us if your child is unable to attend school and also give a reason why . You can let us know by Class Dojo message, email, phone, send in a note or speak to the class teacher.
- If you are planning an extended holiday during term time, we would be grateful if you could let us know, preferably via email.

KINDERGARTEN

- Your child will attend kindergarten for the equivalent of fifteen hours a week.
- You will be notified of your child's kindy roster and the name of their teacher before the beginning of the school year.
- Although kindergarten is not compulsory, the Department of Education (DoE) expects children who enrol to attend regularly.

PRE-PRIMARY

• Pre-primary is the first year of full time compulsory schooling and students are therefore required to attend five days a week.



You can order lunch

You can order lunch for your child from our canteen. The profits from the canteen go to the Parents and Citizens (P&C) Association which in turn donates the money to the school.

Contributions and charges

We will send you a written schedule of the contributions and charges before the beginning of the new school year. The schedule lists the total possible charges for activities that require further payment for students to attend, such as, excursions. The quality of our programs is enhanced when every family pays their voluntary contribution (VCs) which is \$60 per student per year.
